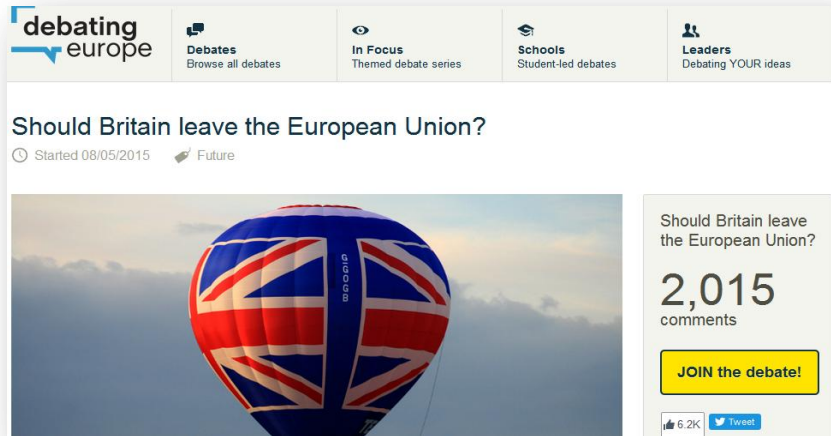


# Data<sup>1</sup> obtained for the debate on Brexit

## Findings

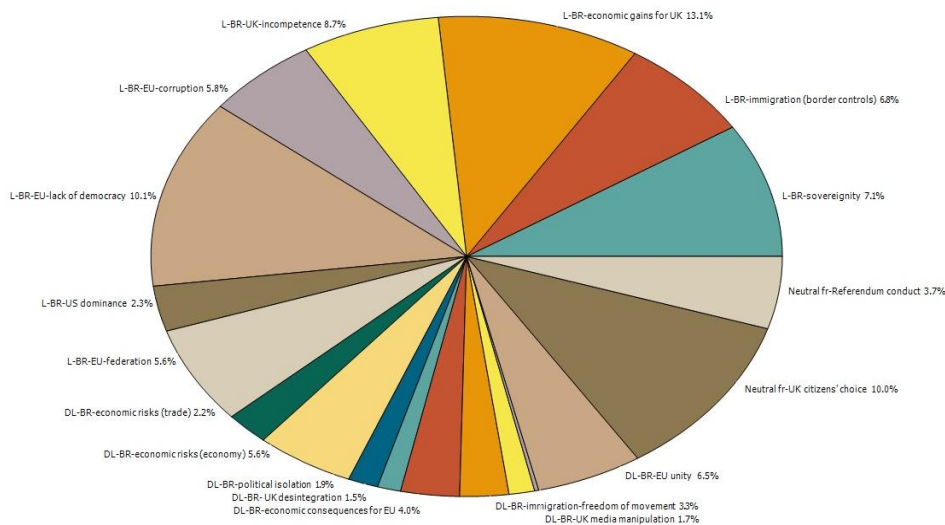


Figure 1. The distribution of (de)legitimizing Brexit frames

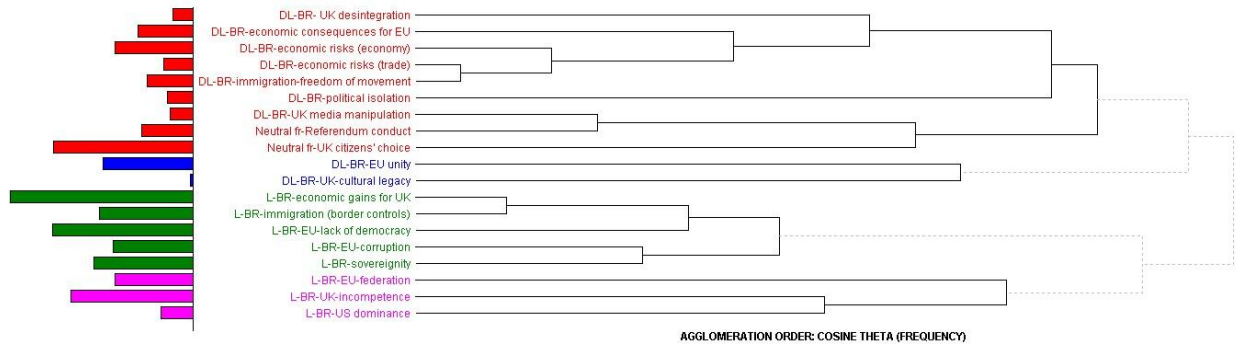


Figure 2. (De)legitimizing Brexit frames – Cluster analysis

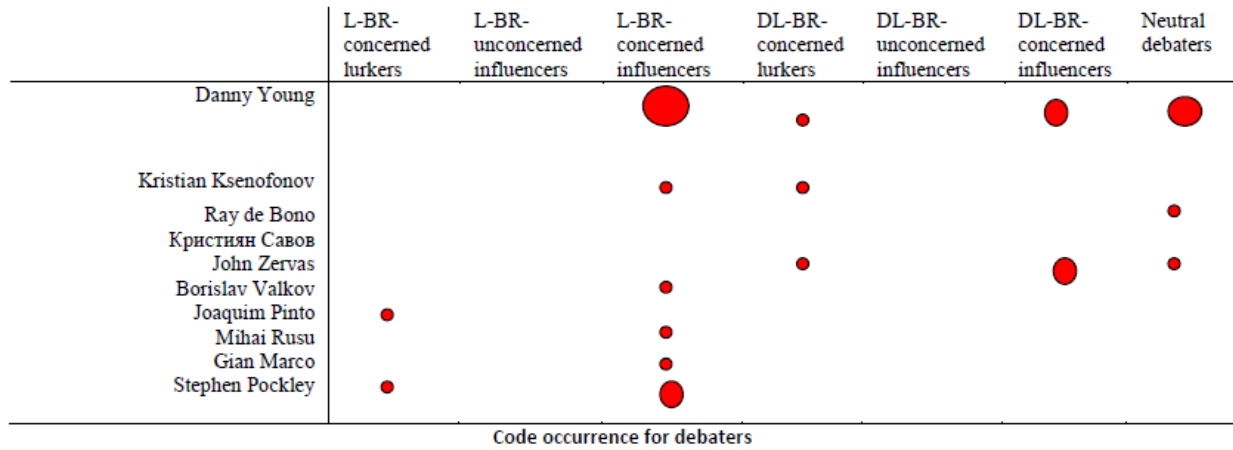


Figure 3. Co-occurrence of types of e (de)legitimizers of Brexit by top ten e-debaters

(Bubble plot)

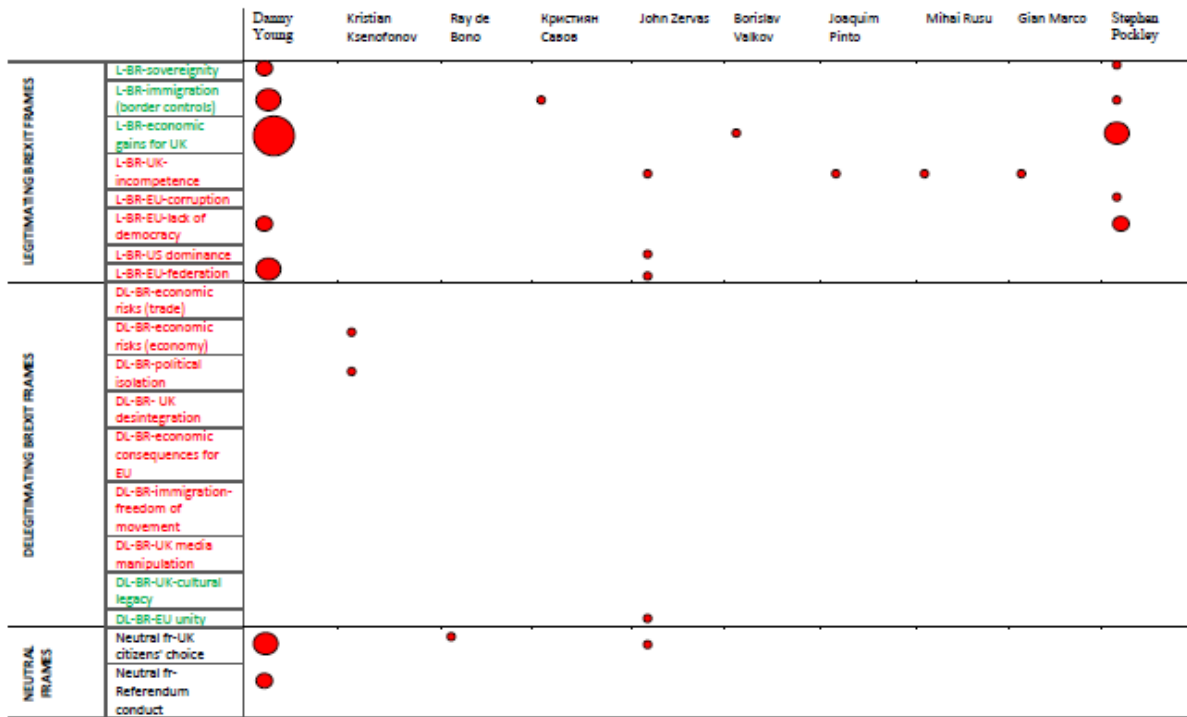


Figure 3. Co-occurrence of types of (de)legitimizing Brexit frames by top ten e-debaters
